

# Notice of Filing of ESR Addendum

## Haldimand County Nanticoke Water Treatment Plant Addendum to Extend the Environmental Study Report

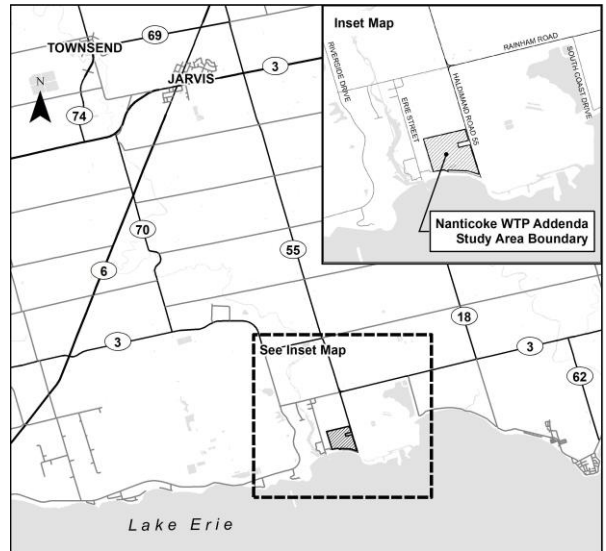
In 2006, Haldimand County completed a Schedule 'C' Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA) Study for the expansion of the Nanticoke Water Treatment Plant. The study was undertaken to identify solutions to address long-term water treatment needs. Due to the lapse in time since filing of the 2006 Environmental Study Report (ESR), Haldimand County has completed an Addendum to extend the ESR. The Addendum was completed in accordance with the MCEA process, which is approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

The ESR Addendum included a lapse of time review, to confirm the proposed project and that the environmental mitigation measures proposed are valid. By this notice, the Report is being placed on public record for a 30-day review period. 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Where a change is being proposed to the undertaking in the Environmental Study Report, a request may be made to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks for an order requiring a higher level of study (i.e., requiring an individual/comprehensive EA approval before being able to proceed), or that conditions be imposed (e.g., require further studies), only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Requests on other grounds will not be considered. Requests should include the requester contact information and full name. Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested (request for conditions or a request for an individual/comprehensive environmental assessment), how an order may prevent, mitigate or remedy potential adverse impacts on Aboriginal and treaty rights, and any information in support of the statements in the request. This will ensure that the ministry is able to efficiently begin reviewing the request. The request should be sent in writing or by email to:

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Requests must also be copied to Haldimand County by mail or by e-mail. Please visit the Ministry's website for more information on requests for orders under section 16 of the Environmental Assessment Act at <https://www.ontario.ca/page/class-environmental-assessments-part-ii-order>. All personal information included in your request – such as name, address, telephone number and property location – is collected, under the authority of section 30 of the Environmental Assessment Act and is collected and maintained for the purpose of creating a record that is available to the general public. As this information is collected for the purpose of a public record, the protection of personal information provided in the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FIPPA) does not apply (s.37). Personal information you submit will become part of a public record that is available to the general public unless you request that your personal information remain confidential.

The proponent, Haldimand County, must wait a minimum of 30-days following the end of the comment period (including any extension) before proceeding with the implementation and construction of the project, subject to a section 16 order request being submitted, the minister making an order or the director issuing a Notice of Proposed Order.
